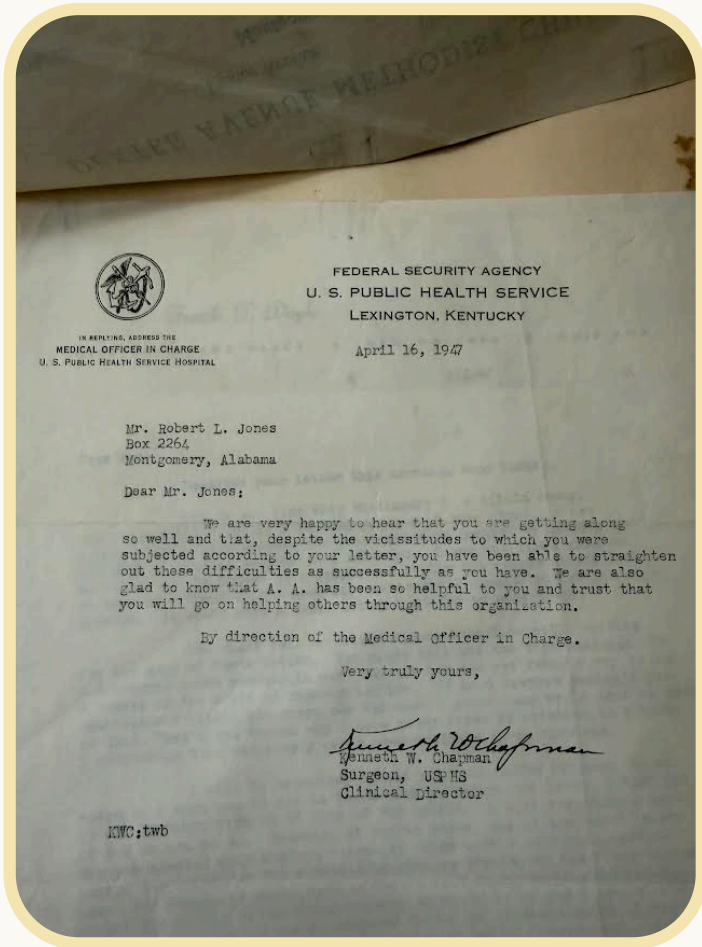

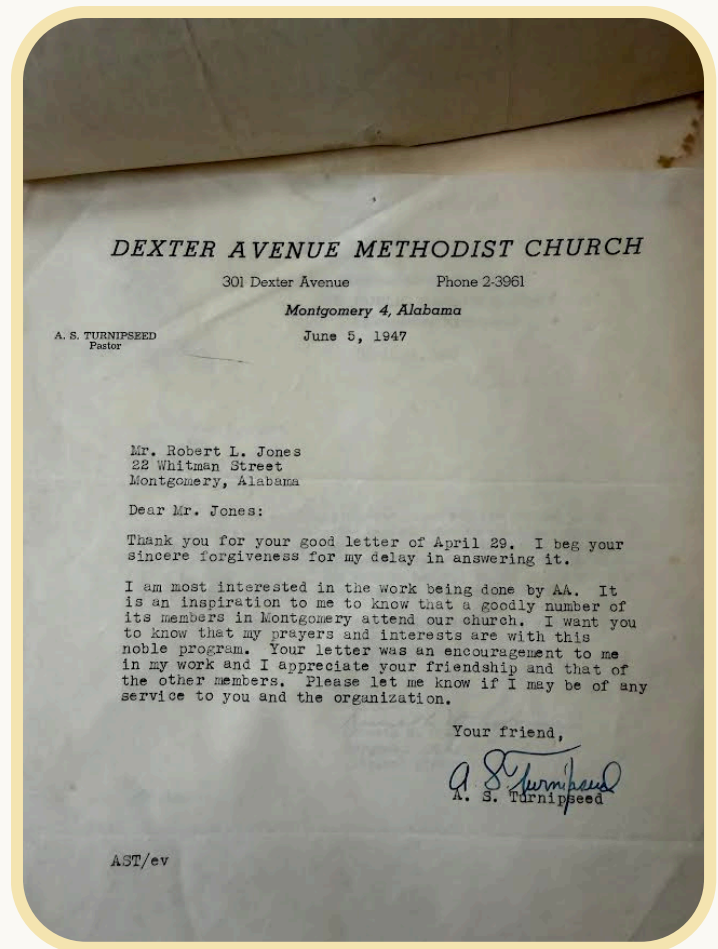

Our wonderful District Archives Chair has been working diligently and has found some absolute treasures that he wishes to share with you all!

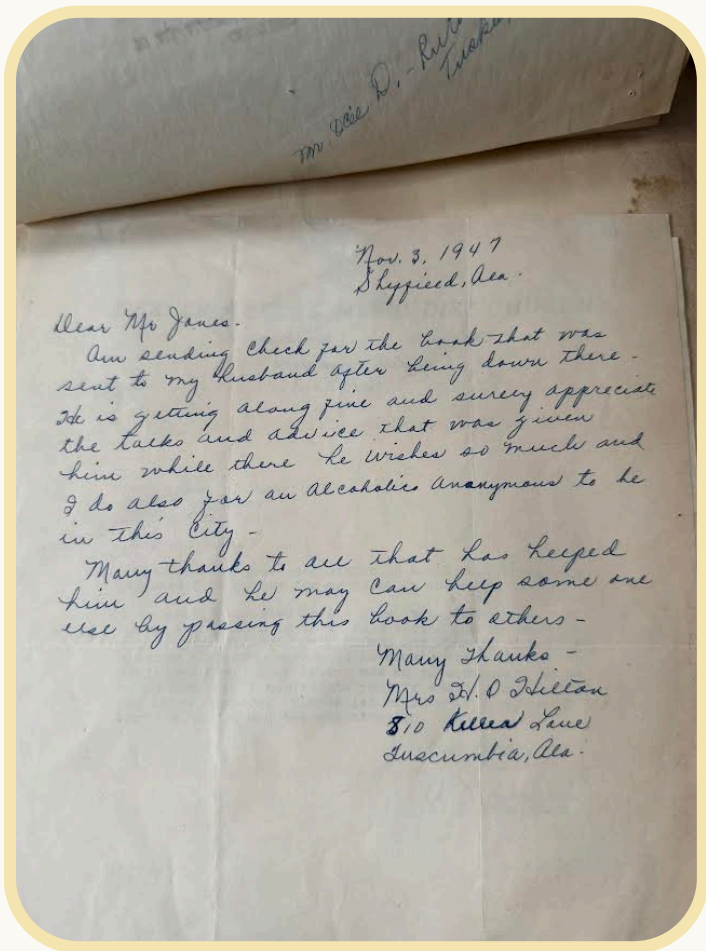


“A 1947 letter from the U.S. Public Health Service offering encouragement and support for continued recovery efforts.”

“A 1947 letter from Dexter Avenue Methodist Church expressing appreciation for the growing local AA community.”

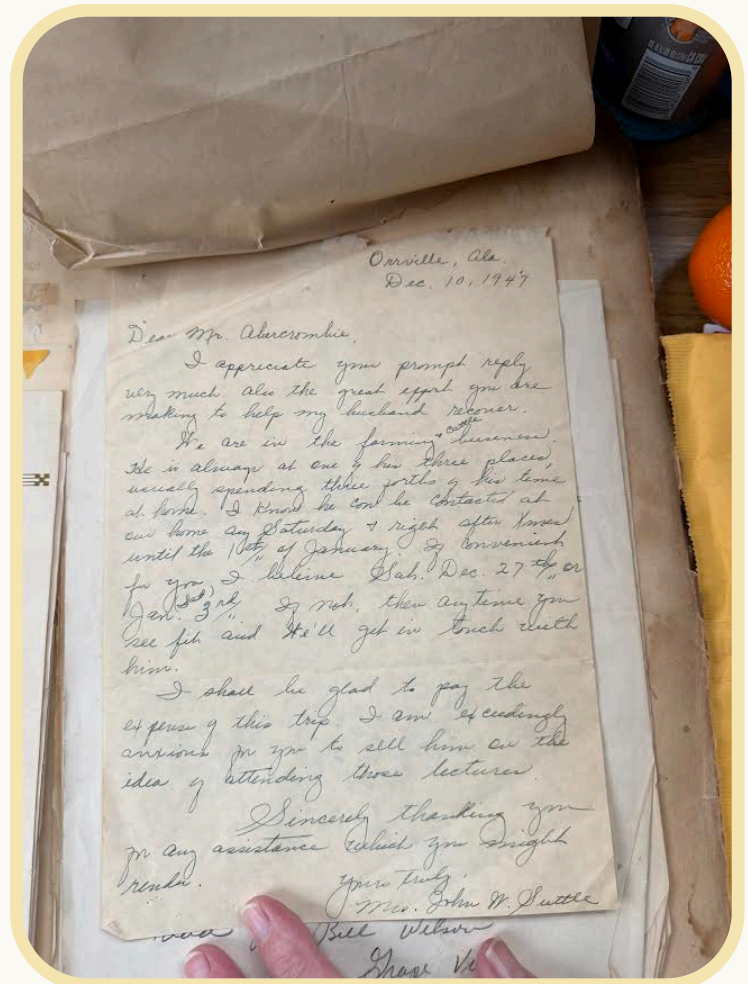

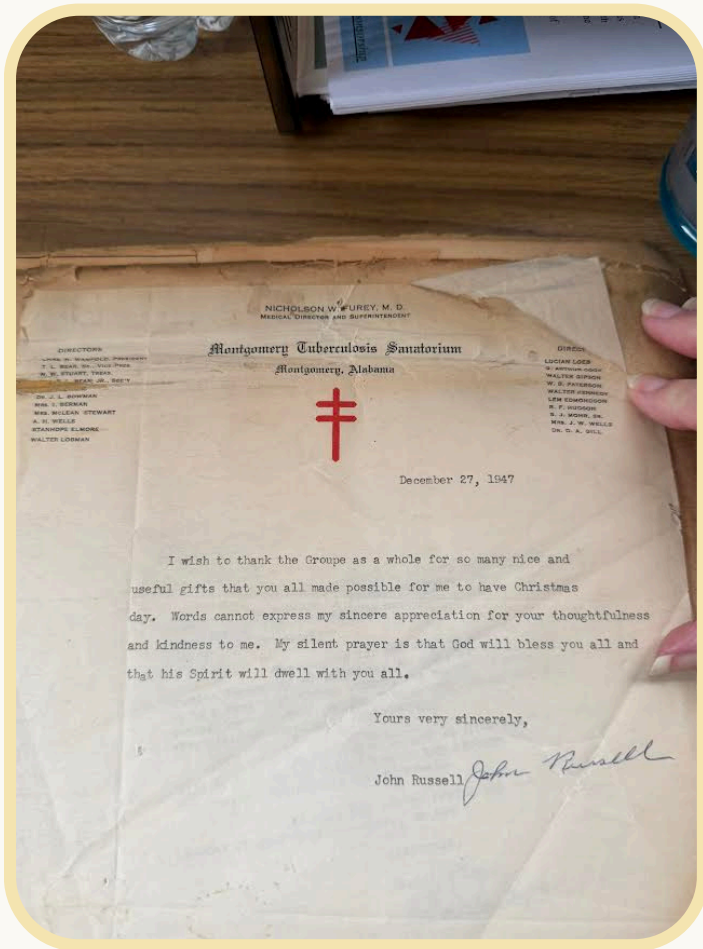


“A handwritten 1947 note of gratitude from a family member thanking AA for guidance and support during recovery.”

“A 1947 handwritten letter expressing appreciation for assistance provided during a family member’s rehabilitation.”

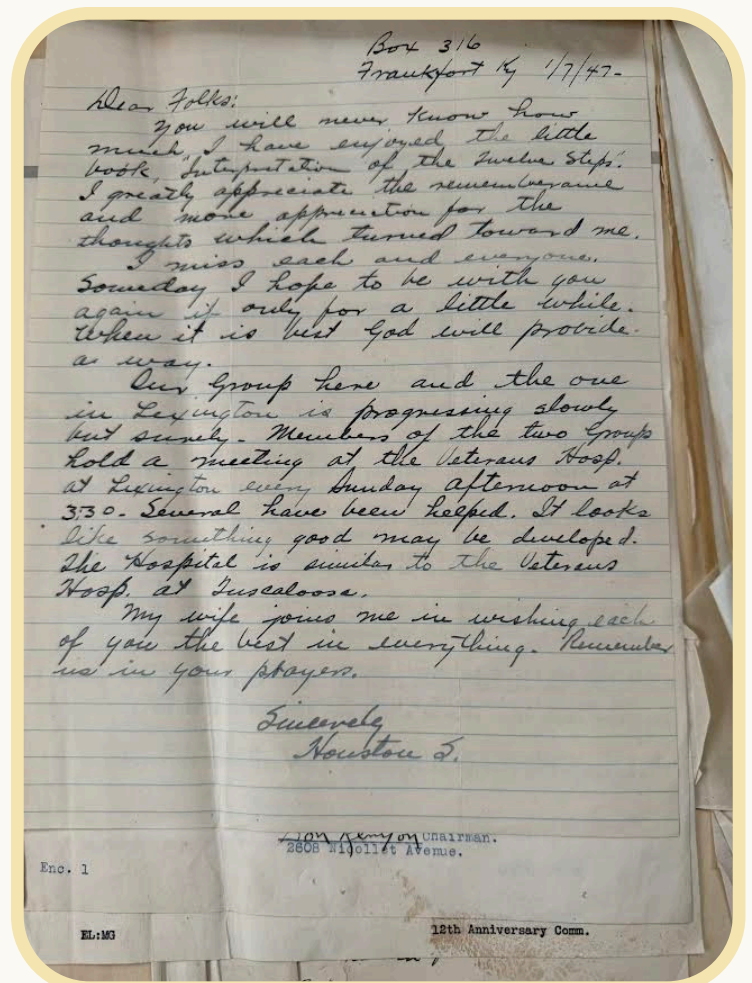

Experience, Strength, and Hope

The brainstorm that was poisoning my life. I was emotional, insecure, and dependent, self-reliance. I had no self-control and it was dangerous. I was walking around heart-broken with no purpose. It all started in 2011 when my wife left me. I was all up to alcohol and other substances. And there was a insurance policy on me. He got wind of it and started a lot of drama in 2011. It had got so bad that alcohol and substances was my solution and I would wake up in the morning and sit there for 30 minutes wondering what job I needed to go to that day.

Now I see that the insurance policy was the best thing that ever happened to me. It made me fold from the structure alcohol and other substances that I had bonded for 20 years. So I ended up going to jail 14 months in Elmore County. I got introduced to the 12 steps. I tried to do them my way — that was insanity.

Experience, Strength, and Hope Continued:

I have always put God first
but only in my prayers, never in action. The 12
steps of recovery have lined my character up and
change my perspective with life and give me
purpose. I've learned to take suggestions. Because
my way don't work. Learned that alcohol is the
number one problem.

On Oct of 2024 I lost my hope.
I did not see nothing on earth going right. From
November 3, 2024 my whole life has changed.
Thank God for AA. The spiritual awakening has
been absolutely consuming. AA has gave me a
purpose in life. I have been bliss, so much thank
God for AA. The answer in the mirror. Since I was a
assembly I have seen a difference between spirit of
authority and spirit of service. I seen the service
worker working where their hearts turned inside out.
The character shining for the good of AA. I was part
of something for the first time in my life.

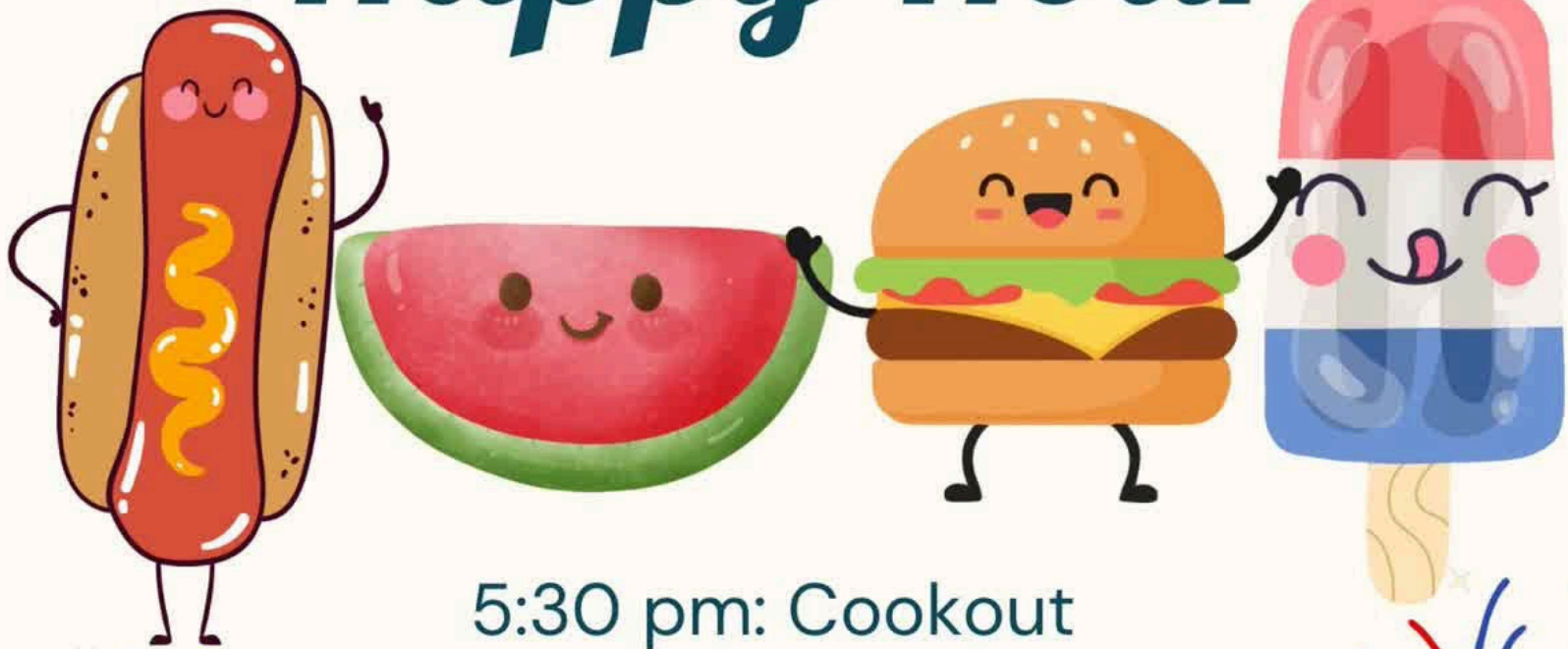

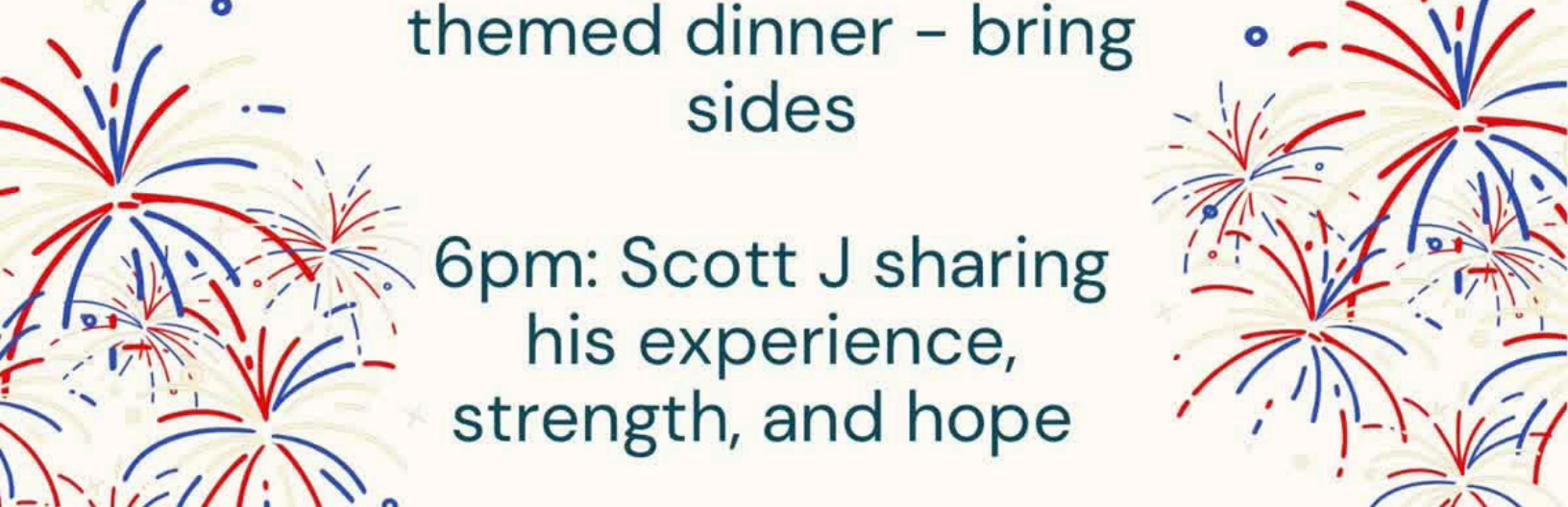
